Neurodiversity at Work

Do you want to learn more about neurodiversity, and how to support neurodiverse team members at work? We all know that we should be aware of neurodiversity, and how to support colleagues in the workplace who may be neurodiverse. But what does the term actually mean? And what practical things can we do to make life at work easier for neurodiverse people?

In this forty-minute course, you'll learn what we mean when we use the word 'neurodiverse', and its counterpart, 'neurotypical'. We'll give you a sense of some of the typical workplace behaviours, norms and sensory stimuli that your neurodiverse colleagues may find stressful, draining or overwhelming – and the simple changes you can make to build a neuro-inclusive culture in your organisation, working towards removing those barriers.

Objectives

By the end of the course, you should be able to:

- Explain what is meant by the term 'neurodiverse'
- Recognise the benefits of neurodiversity at work

- Identify how a 'typical' work environment could significantly impact a neurodiverse employee's daily life
- Support and implement small adjustments that could benefit neurodiverse employees in your workplace

First Aid Essentials

In truth, medical emergencies are frightening, and panic can take over. Have a think about how you might react if someone at work collapsed right now!

In most cases, doing something rather than nothing in those first moments can make all the difference.

Being prepared with a basic knowledge of first aid can give you the confidence to provide immediate comfort and essential care while you wait for the professionals to arrive; you could even help to save a life!

This course aims to increase your awareness of how to provide first aid in some of the most common emergency scenarios in the workplace.

This course addresses some basic first aid responses to common accident and medical emergency situations that you might face in a low-risk workplace.

Please note: This course won't make you a qualified first aider. It's always better for a certified person to administer first aid, but if there are no trained people available, this information provides a basic level of awareness on how to react in the emergency scenarios highlighted.
