After attending the CALC smaller councils meeting yesterday there were a few initial questions about the forthcoming elections in May 2025. Guidance will be issued nearer the time but as a general steer please note the following:

Training for Clerks

Will be offered in early 2025 – more information to follow in due course.

Costs

Cornwall Council's initial suggestion is that the 2025 elections could cost town and parish councils around 25% more than the 2021 elections.

Annual meeting window

1st May: Date of Election

6th May: Date at which Cllrs take office and the first opportunity to issue a summons

12th May: First possible date for annual meeting

22nd May: Last possible date for annual meeting

As I say, more detail to follow in the coming months but hopefully this steer will help with budgeting and meetings calendars for the time being.
