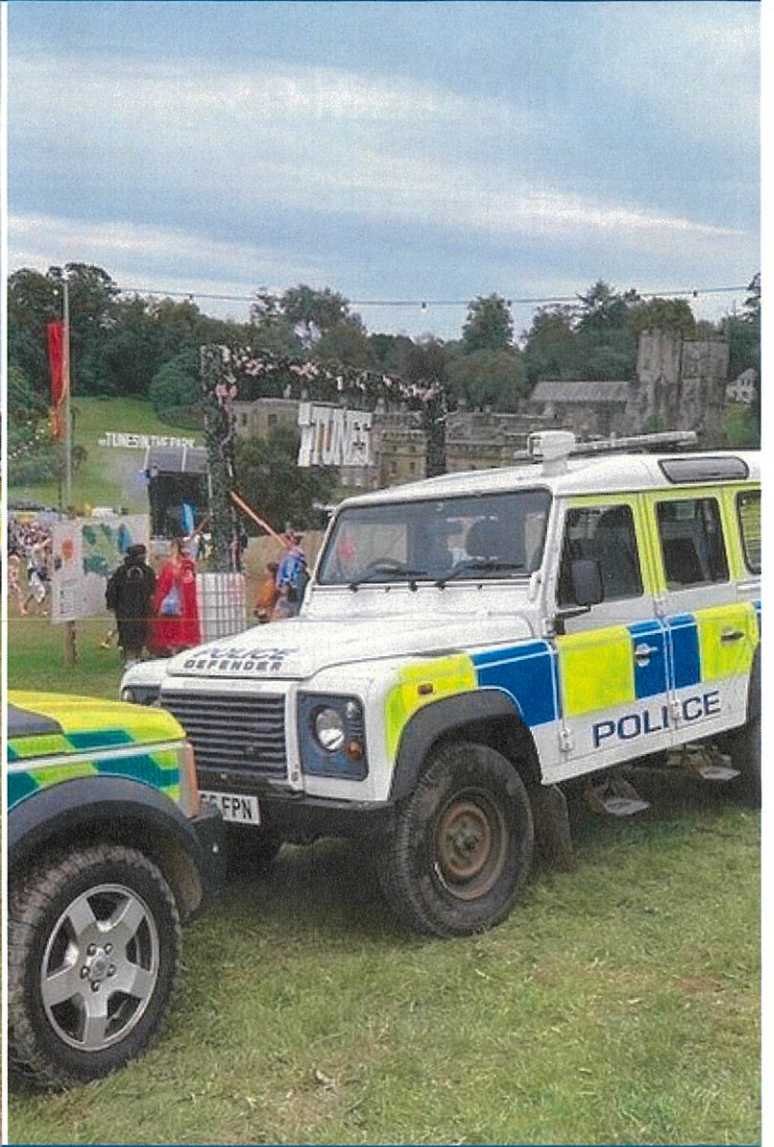

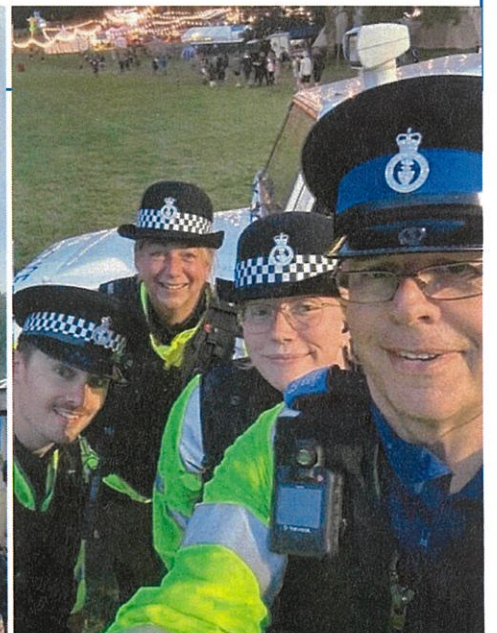


Thank you to those who organised and held the V J Commemoration Ceremony in Liskeard . We will remember them.

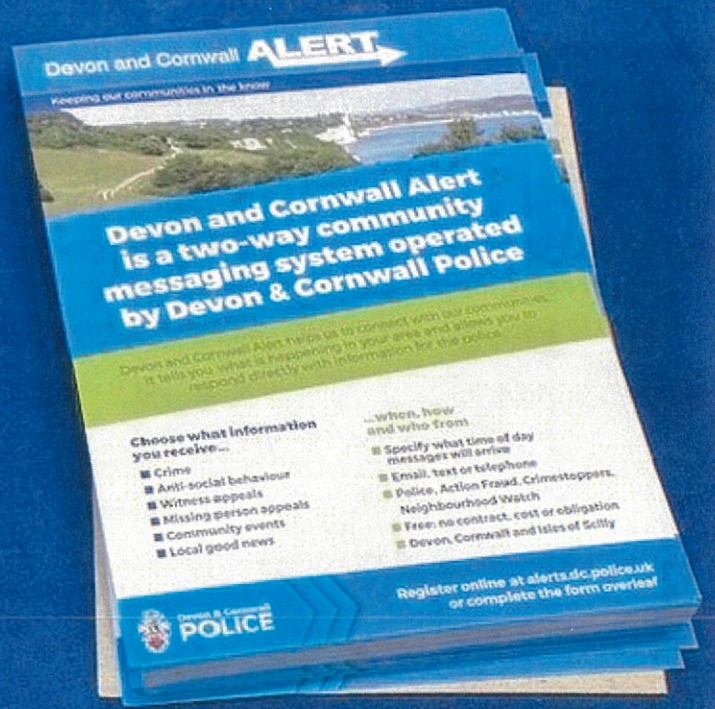
Liskeard Police showed a presence at Tunes in the Park at the Port Eliot . Some good engagement with staff and attendees. Top tunes as well.

#Honda stopped in **#Newquay** - no bike test, expired MOT & VEL - front tyre illegal and rear brake not working -



to top it off positive test for cannabis - vehicle seized, prohibited from future use until repaired and driver arrested [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)

#Zelah - Renault seen to drive at excess speed and was wondering in the lane - when stopped overwhelming smell of cannabis - positive drugs test and small quantity of drugs located in vehicle - driver arrested [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)



#Newquay - van identified as showing false number plates - found to be uninsured, MOT and VEL expired and the driver disqualified until 2026 - he was arrested after also providing a positive drugs test [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)



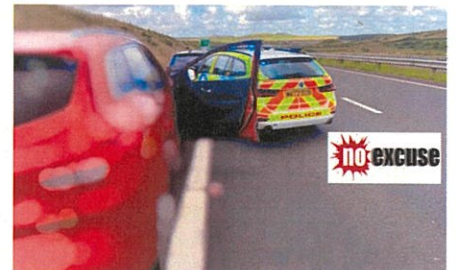
#Newquay - This Peugeot had been reported stolen to police - stopped with [@DC RPT](#) - vehicle seized and driver assisting police with enquiries [#NoExcuse](#)



A30 #Zelah - on the way to collect the police car after the last arrest and an impatient tailgater appears. Overtakes and then exceeds the speed limit [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)



#Bodmin - working with [@DC RPT](#) 2 people in custody for serious offences committed out of force [#NoExcuse](#)



#A30 #CarlandCross - Focus stopped for numerous issues with documentation... driver gave false details but was busted with the fingerprint reader - found to be disqualified and tested positive for cannabis and cocaine - now in custody [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)



A30 #Victoria - van stopped as it showed uninsured - driver gave false details but fingerprints don't lie! Disqualified driver - clearly also under the influence- tested + for cannabis and cocaine - arrested and remains in custody until Monday for court [#NoExcuse](#) [#Fatal5](#)
