PCSO Bex has been in Liskeard School and Community College everyday this week to deliver assemblies to every year group raising awareness of the dangers of vaping.

The children have learnt that there in an increasing amount of illegal vapes being sold to under age children. Legal vapes should only provide the user with 600 puffs, any more is likely to be illegal. Any vapes being sold or advertised missing the health warning is also likely to be illegal. It was also explained to them that they don't always know what is in their vapes. In 2024 Devon and Cornwall Police carried out an operation within 13 secondary schools across the force and worked with the staff to confiscate vapes and vape liquid, these were then tested and 15% of these contained Spice. Spice is a class B drug and is illegal. Spice and THC are a synthetic cannabinoid essentially created to stimulate cannabis.

By June 1st 2025 we will see a ban on disposable vapes.

Disposable vapes should not be placed in domestic or public bins as the battery can pose a fire risk. These should be disposed of at a recycling centre. We are aware many young people will carry vapes in under garments including bras and waist bands. This in itself poses a risk.

Liskeard School is committed to supporting students and ensuring their school is a safe space. If any child would like help to quit or have any concerns they have been encouraged to speak to staff or a health care professional.

Please speak to your child and know the risks involved.

We are aware of two incidents where Saltash residents have received a phone call to arrange a visit from a healthcare professional and have subsequently had a visit from a male, who we are unable to identify. Although the caller has stated on the phone that the visit has been arranged with the knowledge of the residents surgery, this is not the case. The male who has visited residents has stated he is from the NHS but we have been unable to verify this. The male is described as white, around 5ft 8in tall and of medium build with very short receding grey hair and a grey goatee style beard. In both incidents the caller, and the male himself, have stated he is called "Gerry". He is believed to be driving a blue BMW.

This is not how we wanted to start the New Year. Yesterday, 2nd January 2025 at around 16:00hrs a fire was started in a storage container at Saltash Cricket Club, destroying most of the

**club's equipment.** As a community club providing much needed cricket opportunities for Saltash, not only is it a huge blow for the club and volunteers, it will also affect the wider community who play, train and attend matches. At around 18:00hrs further fires were started at Yellowtor Road play area, damaging a see-saw and on

Yellowtor Road, at the junction with Gallacher Way, a Beryl bike was set alight. We are appealing for witnesses who may be able to assist us in investigating these crimes. Did your child come home smelling of smoke last night? Did you see

anything suspicious in the area around the time of the fires or do you have dashcam, CCTV or video doorbell footage?

### VIDEO: Poor driving captured on camera as Op Snap surpasses 20,000 submissions

#### Responsible road users praised for submitting video footage to Operation Snap

Dangerous overtaking, an insecure load falling into the path of motorists and even a car being driven the wrong way up a busy dual carriageway – these are just some of the offences captured on camera and submitted to <a href="Operation Snap">Operation Snap</a>.

The Vision Zero South West road safety partnership has <u>released video footage of several submissions</u> from members of the public, which includes close passes of cyclists, several near misses involving pedestrians, cars mounting pavements and one motorist driving up a grass bank on a dual carriageway.

Last year (2024) was another record year for Op Snap with submissions rising to 6,272, taking the overall number of submissions to more than 20,600 since the scheme was set up in 2019.

Responsible road users have been praised for <u>submitting video footage via the online portal</u> and contributing towards wider road safety ambitions in the region.

Adrian Leisk, Devon & Cornwall Police's Head of Road Safety and chair of the Vision Zero South West enforcement group said: "Police officers cannot be everywhere, so the public's help is vital when it comes to keeping our roads safe.

"20,000 online submissions from concerned road users stands as testament of this effective partnership with our communities, recognising that we all want to be safe on the roads of Devon & Cornwall.

"Everyone will have witnessed driving or riding on our roads that falls far short of an acceptable standard – and quite often this behaviour puts people's lives at risk. This is just not acceptable.

"By submitting video evidence of these incidents through Op Snap, it allows the Police to take action, hold drivers accountable and educate or prosecute those who are falling short. By doing so, we hope to improve the overall standard of road use in Devon & Cornwall and, ultimately, reduce the number of people who are killed or seriously injured.

"Remember, more people than ever own dashcams, helmet cameras, mobile phones and even video doorbells, so it's increasingly likely poor driving will be caught on camera.

"Submissions to Op Snap have resulted in everything from driver education courses to penalty points, hefty fines and even disqualifications. It's just not worth the risk."

Alison Hernandez, Police & Crime Commissioner for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly, is chair of Vision Zero South West.

Commissioner Hernandez said: "I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has taken the time to submit video footage to Op Snap – you are making a positive difference to the safety of road users across the region.

"While surpassing 20,000 submissions shows that the public is eager to work with us towards safer roads, ultimately we'd like to see submissions decrease as general driving standards improve.

"This is about saving lives. In 2023, 48 people were killed and 702 were seriously injured on Devon and Cornwall's roads. All of Vision Zero's members have committed to reducing the number of fatal and serious road collisions by 50% by 2030 – and Op Snap plays a big part in that."


