



Funds are being raised to make up part of a pot of money which will be then used to purchase accessible play equipment for the community.


The pot will comprise of community fundraising, grant funding, donations from community organisations and local Parish Councils and Town Council reserves.


Recently, an accessible drop-off location has been installed outside Bénodet Park.

Waste and Recycling for businesses

From 31 March 2025 it will be compulsory for businesses and certain other non-domestic premises to separate their workplace waste and arrange a recycling collection for glass, metal, plastics, cardboard, paper and food waste.

The new guidelines apply to all businesses and organisations, healthcare establishments and academic institutions. Small businesses with fewer than 10 full-time employees (excluding volunteers) are temporarily exempt until 31 March 2027.

The Government's aim is to improve recycling rates across England, which will help reduce business waste costs, energy usage and protect the environment.

You need to check the legislation to understand when your local council needs to comply (2025 or 2027).

If you haven't already, you also need to contract a waste collector to provide this full range of services. This can be a private waste collector or your local authority.

Cornwall Council can offer a compliant service for businesses.

You must also ensure that the waste company you use is registered on the Public Register of Waste Carriers, Brokers and Dealers.

Devon & Cornwall Furniture Reuse Project

Although we are based in Plymouth, we work just as hard to provide help and support to the people of Cornwall, especially Torpoint and Saltash. The aim of our charity is to bring hope and kindness to disadvantaged people, of any age and to help them towards a brighter future. We do this by providing essential furniture, white goods, household items and advice to around 600 individuals and families a year, free of charge.

People may need help because they are moving to a new property after being homeless, seeking asylum, have a disability, are coming out of care or are in poverty. We work hard to improve the lives of severely disadvantaged people and to make a lasting improvement on their circumstances. We put together packages to include electric blankets, high tog guilts, bedding sets, electric clothes airers and other essentials such as draught excluders, hot water bottles, dressing gowns, hats and scarfs. For those who have no means in which to cook food, who cannot afford it, we will provide slow cookers and microwaves. These packages will be donated to people in need, along with the items we provide free of charge, such as beds, sofas and other essential furniture.

The need for our help from residents in Cornwall has grown exponentially over the last five years and we know from experience that people in Cornwall are severely underserved when it comes to receiving much needed financial help. We help as many people as we can who approach our charity and do not discriminate. Most people we help are vulnerable and living in poverty or are on the verge of being in poverty.

We help hundreds of people a year including those fleeing domestic violence, those seeking asylum, people experiencing homelessness who have been given a property, the elderly, marginalised groups, refugees and those seeking asylum and people experiencing poverty and hardship. People from Cornwall

either approach our charity themselves or are referred. If you need our help please call or email us or go on our website where there is a simple form to complete. To cover our fuel costs and overheads we do charge for delivery but try to keep this as low as possible.

Welcome Home Packs

These packs have everything from microwaves, kettles and toasters, cutlery, dinner & saucepan sets to new bedding backs, bath towels and self-hygiene packs - even hoovers! Also included is a cleaning pack and we never forget the tin opener! If funding allows, we also purchase brand new white goods if a family or individual is in desperate need and are given free of charge.

Welcome Home Room

We have a room upstairs wherein everything is completely free of charge. Dinner sets, saucepans, cups, glasses – too many items to write down. People just pop upstairs and help themselves. Outside the room is an area where we hang curtains and store travel cots – again free of charge.

Warm Safe Place

We built a coffee corner before the pandemic which has now been changed into a warm space. There are a couple of sofas, a TV and blankets. Any volunteer here is always happy to make a warm drink.

BUDGET STATEMENT 2025/26

In order to continue to push forward with key improvements in the town, whilst recognising the current cost of living challenges, the Town Council agreed an increase of 8.05% in the budget for 2025/26, to endeavour to ensure the financial stability of the Town Council. Increased staffing costs, including an increase to the Employers National Insurance contributions, has compounded this increase.

The Library and Community Hub continues to grow from strength to strength and in 2024/25 grant funding of £18,000 was secured, via Volunteer Cornwall, to continue to provide a community space and warmth hub. The team continue to work collaboratively with Awenek Studio CIC, Community Health around Torpoint (CHAT), the Royal Navy, VIVO, Jobcentre Plus and Team Raleigh CIC.

Opening hours are Monday to Friday, 0915 – 1630, with additional opening on the second Saturday of the month from 1000 to 1230 and from 1000 to 1400 on the last Sunday of every month, except December.

The play parks at Cambridge Field, Borough Farm, Chestnut Close and Thanckes Park Play continue to be maintained by the Operations Team, also Rendel, Sparrow and Bénodet Parks together with the Skate Park. The partnership with the LTA (Lawn Tennis Association) saw an investment of £60,000 to refurbish the public park tennis courts in Thanckes Park. Two tennis courts have been renovated, with an accessible path to Court 1, to enable tennis to be accessible to all.

Investment came from the UK Government and LTA Tennis Foundation's Park Tennis Project. Many donations from the local community were received and the council is grateful for all of these. Thanks to a generous donation from St Columba Rugby the tennis courts now have equipment available for all to use. Rackets and tennis balls for the community are located in a code locked box in Court 1 and the access code is sent to all Thanckes Park ClubSpark Tennis members.

The Town Council, supported by the Diverse Advisory Panel, received funding from The Dan Maskell Tennis Trust towards the cost of an adult and a youth sports wheelchair, for the purpose of participation in wheelchair tennis. The Council contributed £300.00 towards the cost of each

wheelchair, in the future the council plans to set out appropriate storage near to the accessible court. Annual membership fees and 'pay to play' court charges will remain the same in 2025/26.

The Town Council is working in partnership with Cornwall Council to deliver suitable redevelopment of the lower end of Fore Street and is pleased to confirm that the demolition of the old police station at the bottom of Fore Street has been successfully completed.

The site has been made safe, with hoardings erected around the perimeter, secured against large concrete blocks. This marks a significant milestone in the Torpoint Town Team Project Board's ongoing efforts to rejuvenate the area. Behind the scenes, work continues to draw up plans for the replacement building to secure planning permission and attract funding and a developer to deliver much-needed homes for local people, along with a new community hub and library - the target is to commence the new development by the summer of 2026.

The Town Council instructed Clifton Emery Design to undertake a feasibility study and provide a Masterplan in relation to land at the lower end of Fore Street. The recommendations of the study have been prepared so that they align with the aspirations of the Vision for Torpoint, a development brief prepared by Cornwall Council about the site, and the emerging Torpoint Neighbourhood Plan.

The feasibility study illustrates how a scheme comprising high quality apartments, a new town library, some small shops and cafés could provide the basis for a development that can meet the aspirations of the Vision. The Torpoint Masterplan consultation concludes on 10th January 2025 and the results will be considered and adopted by the Town Team Project Board and Town Council.

The Town Council anticipates financially supporting these projects in the future: -

Torpoint and Rame Peninsula 9v9 3G All Weather Football Turf Pitch. This project is a collaborative effort between Torpoint Community College, the Town Council, Plymouth YMCA, Torpoint and Rame Active Community Network, Cornwall FA, and the Football Foundation.



It aims to provide a state-of-the-art facility for the benefit of College students' and the wider community. Once funding is secured, building of the facility could be scheduled for Summer 2025 ready to open for the commencement of the academic year in Autumn 2025. The project planning application is being submitted (December 2024) to Cornwall Council and a public consultation event is being scheduled for the New Year.

Additional Vision Projects, including the Lower Fore Street planned improvements.

The installation of up to three pieces of Accessible Play Equipment, into Cambridge Field. Fundraising for this project has been buoyant with many individuals and local organisations contributing to the project, the council is very grateful for these donations. Another fundraising event will be organised in the town, early in 2025.

In May 2024 the Town Council celebrated 50 years'; former Town Mayors' were invited to the Town Meeting, this was an opportunity to give a development update and for residents' to come along and find out about the plans happening in the town.

The Town Council has approved several proposals around equality, diversity and inclusion and this has resulted in the adoption of the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Policy and the council operating in accordance with the best practice document. The Torpoint Diverse Advisory Panel, which consists of Councillors and local residents living with a disability. The Town Council has declared a Climate Emergency and a Climate Emergency Action Plan is on the home page of the Town Council website https://www.torpointtowncouncil.gov.uk/.

The Town Council produce and distributes a Newsletter to all households in the town, it is anticipated this will continue to be produced four times per year with chargeable advertising space available.
