
Ideally, we'd like a timeline to work towards, Mayor Cllr Gary Davis suggested 18 months when we presented and feels that as a group we can add capacity to ensure we're ambitious, and deliver for young people - who grow up fast.

Do you have any advice on the Community Capacity Fund application regarding how the 'feasibility' aspects might support thinking? Please feedback what you feel might be most helpful. Are there any cost issues currently around land ownership / lease on current site and what surveys might need carrying out beyond what a skatepark contractor might cover.

Can you let us know what TCC will be applying for Community Levelling Up Programme (CLUP) and whether any scope for young people / skatepark feature. Is there an opportunity to explore adding to the past £20k pot in past budgets and start to build some reserves for a new facility?

It's good that Cllr Evans is hearing the ongoing desire for a new skatepark... we are really keen to support the Town Vision and work together to create an exciting destination in Torpoint.

As much as we try to push the positive, there is also the reality that the skatepark is not fit for purpose and is likely to cause more injury that improvement to local skaters and scooters. Please see some recent photos.





The current skatepark is long overdue for an upgrade and with others having a head start, let's not be last in Cornwall for a new skatepark!
