Hope you're... TRF had our AGM last night and it was lovely to welcome five new residents to our committee.

Tom Crago has stepped up to chair the group for 2025, Eleanor Bonsor (who did a great job last year as chair) has now offered to be Treasurer. I remain Secretary and happy to keep the communications flowing - as we progress ambition for a new skatepark in the town.

We're attaching a very brief impact report from 2024 work and want to build on things in here - have a read!

Also attaching a summary of the Torpoint Skatepark Community Survey, which we'll keep open to allow parents and young people to continue to feed I their views. I am happy to run through wider answers (including other things residents would enjoy at the park and in the town).

We'd like to set-up a meeting with relevant stakeholders (aware is lease arrangements between Cornwall / Torpoint) and to agree next steps, to get *in principle* agreement that the existing skatepark can be redeveloped, scope of how we engage design companies (we plan to put some funding applications in to ensure we keep young people involved in the process). This project offers opportunities to improve drainage, revitalise the basketball area, explore a BMX pump track, youth shelter and make the scheme better talk to Benodet walled gardens as well as the football pitch etc... we can collaborate and build a brief for future skatepark design companies.

We're aware that <u>Liskeard Town Council</u> has fast-tracked it's skatepark and we feel Torpoint Skatepark needs to be on the map as soon as possible - so how we fundraise and work with TTC effectively is important, especially re levelling up funding, CIL, and any future infrastructure investment new housing developments might bring. We can do some Crowdfunding and more but need solid backing behind this project.

We're ready to move things forwards... in turn sustaining our volunteers' enthusiasm and managing expectations off young people *desperate* for a new skatepark.

Introduction

Torpoint Ramps Forum is a voluntary community group dedicated to improving recreational spaces for young people in Torpoint. In 2024, we worked to engage the community, promote the need for a new skatepark and advocate for better facilities.

Key Achievements in 2024

Community Engagement

- Conducted an extensive community survey, gathering feedback from local residents, with over 150 responses.
- o Engaged with over 30 children through various activities and outreach efforts.

Events & Outreach

- Attended Torpoint Street Markets speaking with families and offering free skateboard repairs.
- Organised a Festive Social & Raffle in December, bringing together young people, parents, and supporters to discuss plans for the skatepark.

Committee & Volunteer Work

- Held **12 committee meetings** throughout the year to coordinate efforts.
- Logged over 200 hours of volunteer time from our dedicated team (8 volunteers in total) and supporters.

Fundraising


- Successfully applied for a Town Council Section 137 grant to support start-up costs (insurance, marketing and safeguarding support)




Torpoint Community Skatepark Survey Overview as of January 2025

Do you think a new skatepark will benefit Torpoint? 148 responses








Where do you live






What do you ride the most? 148 responses




How often do you use Torpoint skatepark currently? 148 responses

Community Voices: Why Torpoint Needs a New Skatepark

- "Skateparks are destinations now. A new one in Torpoint would put us on the map and give my kids a great place to enjoy."
- "The current skatepark is not usable or safe. The awful surfacing and constant water make it hazardous."
- "I have been a skater most of my life, and it has always given me a massive outlet. As a kid,
 I met most of my long-time friends through skating, and it kept us out of trouble."


Short Summary of Desired Improvements for Torpoint Skatepark

The local community has highlighted key improvements needed for the Torpoint skatepark:


- Complete Redesign & Resurfacing Many respondents called for a full rebuild, with smooth concrete to replace the rough and hazardous surface. Proper drainage is also a major concern.
- Better Ramps & Layout Requests included more ramps, a bowl, a half-pipe, flat rails, ledges, and a better flow between obstacles to make the park more usable.
- Inclusivity & Social Spaces Suggestions included dedicated areas for beginners and younger users, seating for parents, and even a small café to create a welcoming space.
- Facilities for All Wheeled Sports Many want the park to accommodate skateboards,
 BMX, scooters, and rollerblades, with a bike jump track or pump track as an additional feature.
- Safety & Maintenance Concerns over gravel, vandalism, and poor visibility led to calls for better upkeep, lighting, CCTV, and regular maintenance to ensure long-term usability.
